Dear Colleagues,

Grace and Peace to you all. I am grateful for this passage from Romans 8: 38-39 which reminds us that the love of God is with us, even when we face great challenges and even death. Many of us have felt that it has been a whole year of Lent already. We have encountered our mortality more closely than we might have wished. May this Lent be a time in which you find yourselves journeying intimately with our Saviour who chose to live as one of us and who triumphed over death.

Although we have seen some progress in the decreasing numbers of new cases, the presence of new Covid-19 variants is worrying. As long as we continue to be in the Red Zone throughout our diocese, I am asking you to **continue to hold services virtually**. If there is a compelling reason why you need to hold in-person services for 10 people, please be in touch with <u>Archdeacon Robert Camara</u>, the safe church officer. I want to congratulate all who have continued to hone their skills of leading worship online and especially those of you who have recently joined the ranks of Zoom and Facebook and Go To Meeting.

Please remember that your **continuing education funds** exist for the benefit of your employer and that they may be spent on anything that will enrich and develop the ministry that you do. If you do not have a computer that is equipped for Zoom, including a camera and microphone, now would be a good time to acquire one. A number of people and parishes in the Diocese have signed up for a Tuesday night course at Montreal Dio on "Anglican Origins: Uncovering the Roots of our Tradition" beginning Feb. 23rd, with a reduced rate for members of the Corporation.

I am very pleased that our Primate, The Most Rev Linda Nicholls will lead **The Annual Clergy Lenten Retreat**, beginning **March 14**th **at 7pm and ending March 16 at noon** after Renewal of Ordination Vows, and the Blessing of Oils. Even though it will be an online event, clergy are asked to set aside this time for rest and refreshment. The theme will be "**Radical Resilience and Hope**". A registration form will be sent out next week.

I have been **visiting clericus** gatherings again, just to see the clergy and catch up on your news. I've been delighted to hear of your creative efforts and of the good response that you have been having. As always, I welcome a chance to speak personally with you and to discuss your
