Dear Clergy and Wardens,

Further to Bishop Mary's announcement on Sunday at the Annual Clergy Lenten Retreat, the provincial government has made several announcements about restrictions to in-person worship in the last week.

Please note that effective <u>Friday, March 26, 2021</u> the government will relax the restrictions on places of worship in red zones regarding the number of people that are permitted to gather to allow for a maximum of <u>25 persons total</u> (or 50% of capacity with 2 meters distance between households, whichever is less).

Parishes who had already received permission (last Fall) to re-open in-person worship may re-open for worship in Phase II or Phase III (depending on which phase you were in when we reverted to Phase I) effective **Sunday, March 28**, **Palm Sunday**. If you have not already done so, you are asked to be in touch with my office to confirm your desire to re-open for in-person worship and to let the Diocese know in which phase you will be re-opening.

Since our last update, the province has also pushed the curfew to 9:30pm in red zones, which will allow parishes who were planning services during Holy Week to gather in-person during the evening.

Another change relates to the use of masks. The province has made it a requirement that everyone attending in-person worship must wear a procedural mask – cloth masks may be worn in addition to the procedural mask, but at minimum a procedural mask should be worn.

All other guidelines as outlined in the Diocesan Guidelines for Re-Opening Churches are in effect, which would include: physical distancing, a record-log of attendees for contact tracing purposes, sanitization of hands and common touch places, no congregational singing, the use of 1 or 2 cantors who are at a greater distance from the congregation present, etc.
